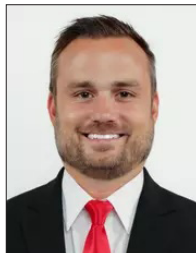

WORKING CREDENTIALS

Credentials for members of the media to all regular-season home matches can be obtained through the Sports Communications Office. Credentials will be issued on a season basis. Please contact Ryan Cullinane if interested.

PHOTOGRAPHERS & VIDEOGRAPHERS

Only recognized photographers and videographers have permission to shoot on the courts. All photographers and videographers wishing to shoot at practice or matches must check in with UGA Sports Communications before doing so.

All individuals interested in shooting practice should directly contact UGA Sports Communications. On match days, photographers and videographers may call, email or check in directly with the pressbox prior to or during the match.

Photographers and videographers will be allowed to shoot from the court level, provided that they follow the specific rules set forth by the UGA Sports Communications office and the UGA Event Management staff.

SEC CHAMPIONSHIP CREDENTIALS

Credentials to the 2024 Southeastern Conference Championship, April 17-21 hosted by LSU, can be requested through LSU's Sports Communications department.

INTERVIEW SCHEDULE

Throughout the season, practices are open to the media after contacting and receiving approval from the Sports Communications office. The viewing periods for practice will typically last between 15-45 minutes.

Interviews will generally be conducted before practice. However, other arrangements can be made by contacting Georgia Sports Communications.

Media desiring to conduct interviews online or over the phone should make arrangements through the Sports Communications office as well, and not through the individual coaches or players. These will be coordinated according to the person's availability, usually prior to, or immediately after, practice sessions.

GAME DAY MEDIA SERVICES

All media will enter Dan Magill Tennis Complex at the gate closest to the men's tennis building and Foley Field.

The press box inside the Dan Magill Tennis Complex sits atop the grandstands overlooking courts one, two and three on the Henry Feild Courts. To access the press box, head underneath the grandstands and look for the door with an elevator sign above it. Enter into the room and take the elevator up to the second floor, which will open directly into the press box.

Final box scores, media guides, updated game notes and statistics for both Georgia and its visiting opponents will be available in the press box.

Following each match, a recap will be emailed to the media and posted on www.GeorgiaDogs.com, the official website of Georgia Athletics. The website will also include a box score and updated statistics. If you would like to be included on the email list, please contact UGA Sports Communications.

POST-MATCH INTERVIEWS

Interviews will be conducted on court one of the Henry Feild Courts. Media will be surveyed when either team needs one point to clinch the match for which player from the Georgia men's tennis roster they would prefer to interview in addition to Coach Diaz.

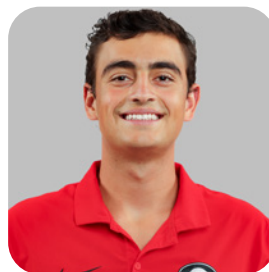

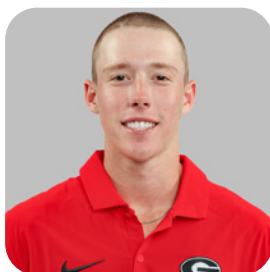

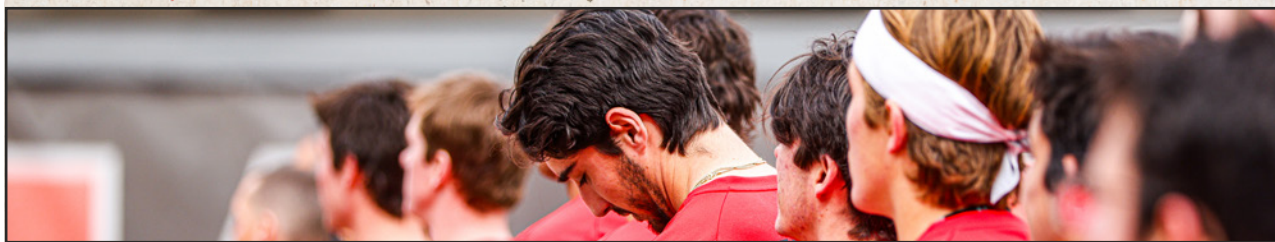

SEASON PREVIEW

The University of Georgia's men's tennis team entered the 2023-2024 season with several fresh faces. Seven new student-athletes were added to the roster with three returning athletes - juniors Thomas Paulsell, Miguel Perez Peña and redshirt sophomore Filipe Costa. Regardless of the lack of returning lettermen, the integrity and remarkable reputation of the men's tennis program continue to uphold its standards with every new player. The culture of Georgia's program reigns evident with each addition to the team as they combined to win 70 singles matches during the fall season.

Ryan Colby, a standout transfer student from The University of Southern California, has already dominated since becoming a Bulldog and enters the season ranked No. 36 in singles. He won the Longhorn Invitational title, beating three ranked players in singles, including a new career-best win against No. 17 Micah Braswell (Texas) and a three-set win against No. 22 Peter Makk (USC). In doubles, he won the red draw doubles title at the 55th annual Southern Intercollegiate Championships with Niels Ratiu, going undefeated at the event. The tandem ended the fall with an 8-3 record together, earning a No. 42 national ranking with Ratiu.

The freshman in particular have wasted no time, having already embraced the team's heart and character it's traditionally known for. In the fall, Cyrus Mahjoob earned his first ranked singles win on day two of the Gamecock Kickoff, defeating VCU's No. 78 Mathis Bondaz in three sets and reaching the semifinals of the ITA Southeast Regional, falling to eventual champion and teammate Miguel Perez Peña. His successes allowed him to be the lone Georgia freshman to earn a singles ranking in the final ITA poll of the fall, checking in at No. 112.

Ratiu also saw success at the Gamecock Kickoff, winning all three matches in both singles and doubles in Columbia, S.C. Ratiu won two of his three singles matches in straight sets and played with a different doubles partner in each match. Freddy Blaydes joined the team in January and won his first two collegiate matches at the Gamecock Kickoff. In doubles, he beat Jelani Sarr and Lucas Andrade da Silva (S.C.) in a 6-3 decision with Thomas Paulsell and also defeated Hunter Heck and Kenta Miyoshi (Ill.), 6-4, with Ratiu.

Parker Jacques finished 3-1 in the silver draw at the 55th annual Southern Intercollegiate Championships, winning all three matches in straight sets. Jacques understands the dedication that comes with representing "The G." Davis Taylor advanced to the black draw quarterfinals at the 55th annual Southern Intercollegiate Championships. Parker Mariencheck also has had a good start to the season and went undefeated at the Georgia Tech Invitational.

As for the returnees, they have been strong in their leadership and carried the Bulldogs' legacy of excellence. Paulsell ended his previous season on court one in doubles with Ethan Quinn during the second round of the NCAA Tournament against Oklahoma, earning his first point-clinching win of his career in the Super Regional. He kept his momentum going into the new school year and won the red draw singles title at the 55th annual Southern Intercollegiate Championships. His successes brought him a new career-best singles ranking of No. 41.

After winning 30 matches last year, good for the second-most on the team, Perez Peña continued improving throughout the offseason and started the year hot. He won the ITA Southeast Regional singles title, clinching a spot at the ITA National Fall Championships and becoming the second-straight Bulldog to win the event. He also earned a new career-best singles win at the Longhorn Invitational, defeating No. 55 Youcef Rihane (FSU) in three sets on Sept. 22. He will enter the year ranked No. 43 in singles. Lastly, Filipe Costa finished 2-0 in the silver draw at the 55th annual Southern Intercollegiate Championships, winning both matches in straight sets. He won four total matches in the fall and is up to six in his career after battling back from injuries over the past two seasons.

The Georgia men's tennis team's season will begin with a doubleheader home opener at the Dan Magill Tennis Complex on Monday, Jan. 22nd at 1:00 p.m. and 4:00 p.m. against Eastern Kentucky University. This will be the third meeting between the two programs and the first since 1971. Georgia is 2-0 against EKU, with the Bulldogs winning its first match against the Colonels in 1966 by a 7-2 score and in a 9-0 sweep in the previous meeting. EKU finished 4-19 last season and ended its season in the first round of the ASUN Conference Tournament.

MOMENTS AT MAGILL

The complex has hosted the men's NCAA Championships a total of 24 times, the women's Championships three times and both genders five times, most recently in 2017. It played host to 13 NCAA Championships in a row from 1977-89. Five of Georgia's six National Championships in men's tennis and one of the two women's NCAA titles were won on their home courts at the Dan Magill Tennis Complex.

Georgia hosts the NCAA Championships for the first time.

The complex is officially named the Dan Magill Tennis Complex after Bulldog great Dan Magill. Magill led Georgia as head coach for 34 years.

Diaz becomes the winningest coach in SEC tennis history as he reaches 707 career victories with a 4-0 win over No. 3 Ohio State. The number surpasses only that of his mentor and former coach Dan Magill.

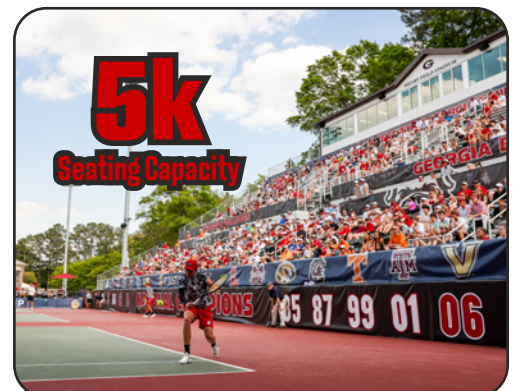

Playing host of the 1985 NCAA Championships, the Bulldogs win the title for the first time in program history.

As host of the 2007 NCAA Championship in Athens, Ga., the Bulldogs take the title for the fifth time, their third under the leadership of Manny Diaz.



The newly renovated Dan Magill Tennis Complex was unveiled in February 2020. The \$8.5 million renovation project marked the largest makeover for the complex since 2002. It features a new grandstand to Henry Feild Stadium with chair-back seating in the lower levels, permanent concession stands, restrooms and a new 1,750-square foot handicap-accessible press box. New umpire headquarters, as well as additional seating along the grass, can be seen at the complex.



The University of Georgia men's and women's tennis programs announced that the \$26.7 million dollar renovation to the Lindsey Hopkins Indoor Tennis facility is officially underway on Nov. 1, 2022. The project is scheduled to be completed during the 2024 dual match season.

The updated facility will feature six indoor courts, 600 spectator seats, concessions, will have updated Play-sight live stream cameras installed, feature premium gameday locker rooms, a team meeting room, electronic scoring and much more.

"We are so thankful for the vision and support the University of Georgia, Josh Brooks and his staff have for our tennis programs and this project," said head coach Manuel Diaz. "When completed, our new six-court indoor facility will be one of the best in the nation and we will once again be able to host the NCAA Championships. Along with our recently renovated outdoor stadium, we look forward to giving our fans a great place to watch tennis."

"I am extremely excited that we are beginning construction on our new indoor tennis facility," said former women's tennis head coach Jeff Wallace. "This will greatly enhance our tennis programs moving forward. The addition of two more courts is a game-changer that allows us to play matches with every player on the court, at the same time. We are so thankful for Josh Brooks and his staff for prioritizing this facility."

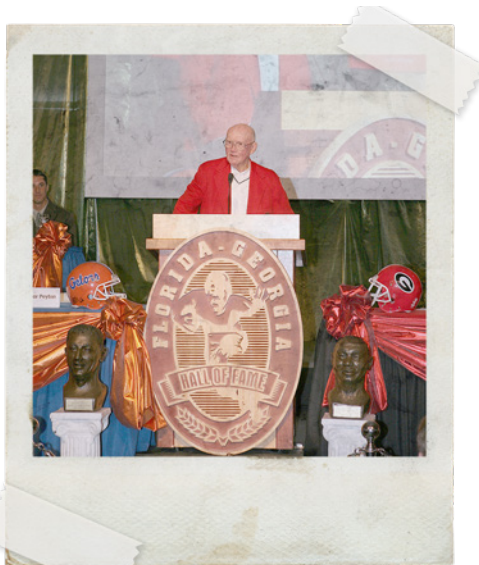

DAN MAGILL - GEORGIA LEGEND



Dan Magill could be argued as the greatest Bulldog of all time.

Magill led the men's tennis program at the University of Georgia for 34 years, helping the team earn two NCAA National Championships, 12 SEC Championships, accumulated 706 wins, developed players to 27 All-American honors and 61 All-SEC distinctions, an NCAA Singles National Champion and a NCAA Doubles National Champion during his tenure.

He served as a sports information director from 1949-1977, also holding the title of Associate Athletic Director of Public Relations until he retired in 1995, overseeing the men's and women's tennis teams.

Magill's legacy lives on at the University of Georgia with the Dan Magill Tennis Complex and the Dan Magill Press Box at Sanford Stadium both receiving his namesake in 1993 and 1999 respectively. He was inducted into the UGA Circle of Honor, the highest honor for coaches and athletes at the university, in 1996 for his numerous contributions to the athletic association.

Magill is also a member of the National Collegiate Hall of Fame, the State of Georgia Hall of Fame, the Southern Tennis Hall of Fame and the Inter-collegiate Tennis Association Hall of Fame. Magill passed away on August 23rd, 2014 at the age of 93. He lives on as one of the most influential people to ever be involved in collegiate athletics.

MANUEL DIAZ – HEAD COACH

Manuel Diaz's numbers speak for themselves - He has won 29 Southeastern Conference Championships and six national championships in 36 seasons at the helm of the Georgia men's tennis program.

The Hall of Fame coach, who followed the 'greatest Bulldog of them all' and one of the founding fathers of modern collegiate tennis, Dan Magill, has become a name synonymous with the sport. Diaz won his 709th all-time match during the shortened 2019-20 season, passing his mentor Magill for the most wins in SEC history (now at 767 career wins).

Diaz, just the second coach in the program's storied history, is also the recipient of the 2020 Coach Dan Magill Impact Award — an honor given annually by the State of Georgia Tennis Hall of Fame. He became the third Bulldog inducted into the USTA Southern Hall of Fame on Jan. 20, 2024, joining his mentor Magill and six-time All-American Al Parker. Diaz was introduced into the ranks by previous USTA CEO and former Georgia great Gordon Smith.

The 2023-24 campaign marks the 36th season as head coach for Diaz, who has led Georgia to six national championships - four NCAA titles (1999, 2001, 2007 and 2008) and two ITA National Indoor titles (2006 and 2007). He is one of only three active coaches with multiple NCAA titles and, since becoming head coach in 1988, Diaz has guided the Bulldogs to 29 SEC titles (19 regular season crowns and 10 tournament championships).

The 2018-19 season brought his 700th win, putting him just six victories away from matching the SEC-record of legendary head coach Magill's 706 career wins. Diaz owns a 767-192 record — an 80-percent win percentage and average of 21 wins per year.

The Bulldogs have ended the season ranked in the top-five nationally 19 times under Diaz, also finishing in the top-10 27 times and the top-25 in 33 of his years as head coach.

The 2016-17 SEC regular season title gave the program its fifth-straight SEC championship for the first time since 1971-75. Diaz, the 2017 SEC Coach of the Year, guided the Bulldogs to their second consecutive NCAA semifinals and 24th overall. The top-ranked duo of Jan Zielinski and Robert Loeb earned All-America status after advancing all the way to the 2017 NCAA Doubles Championship match.

Under his leadership, the Bulldogs finished with a perfect SEC record in 2015-16, becoming the first Georgia team to achieve an unblemished SEC record since the 2007 NCAA Championship squad went 32-0.

In 2013, his 25th season at the helm, Diaz led UGA into the semifinals of the NCAA Tournament for the sixth time in eight years. In his 700th career match at the helm of Georgia's program, Diaz's Bulldogs swept both the SEC regular season and

tournament crowns for the seventh time in school history. On March 10, 2013, Diaz moved into second place on the all-time SEC wins list behind only his mentor Dan Magill.

Diaz led the Bulldogs to their second consecutive NCAA Championship in 2008. The sixth NCAA team championship title in school history, Diaz has accounted for four of them as the head coach (1999, 2001, 2007, 2008), and he was also an assistant coach under Magill on both of the other winning squads (1985, '87).

In addition to his four NCAA Championships, Diaz's teams have reached the NCAA finals seven other times: 1989, 1991, 1993, 1997, 1998, 2002, and 2006. Georgia was also undefeated (32-0) in 2007 and 30-1 in 2006, with its lone loss coming in the NCAA final.

From April 23, 2005, to March 19, 2010, Diaz coached the Bulldogs to 71 straight wins at the Dan Magill Tennis Complex, the second-longest home winning streak in program history. Diaz led Georgia to 11 consecutive national top-five finishes from 1989 to '99, a feat no other school in the country can match.

Diaz's Bulldogs won the program's first-ever triple crown of tennis in 2001, as the team won its second national title in three years, while Matias Boeker won the NCAA singles crown and teamed with Travis Parrot for the doubles championship. It was only the third time since 1977 that such a feat had been accomplished.

A seven-time SEC Coach of the Year (1989, 1995, 2001, 2006, 2007, 2017 and 2023), Diaz has seen 40 players earn a combined 97 All-American honors. With Diaz at the helm, five Bulldogs have been four-year All-Americans: Al Parker (1988-91), Mike Sell (1992-95), Jamie Laschinger (1993-96), Steven Baldas (1995-98), Bo Hodge (2001-04) and most recently John Isner (2004-07).

Diaz was selected as the Wilson/ITA National Coach-of-the Year in 1995, 2001 and 2007. For his outstanding contribution to tennis in his home country of Puerto Rico, Diaz was inducted into the Puerto Rican Tennis Hall of Fame in 1998. In 2000, he was inducted into the Georgia Tennis Hall, while in 2017, he was among four athletes and coaches conducted into the Georgia Sports Hall of Fame.

A native of San Juan, Puerto Rico, Diaz is married to the former Suzanne Rondeau of Toronto, Canada. They have three sons: Manuel III, Eric and Alex. Alex and Eric both played on Georgia's men's tennis team. Eric earned his degree in the spring of 2015 and is now leading his company Tier1 Performance Tennis Academy in Newport Beach, Ca., coaching some top professionals on the pro tour including Alex Michelsen who was originally signed to be a Bulldog.

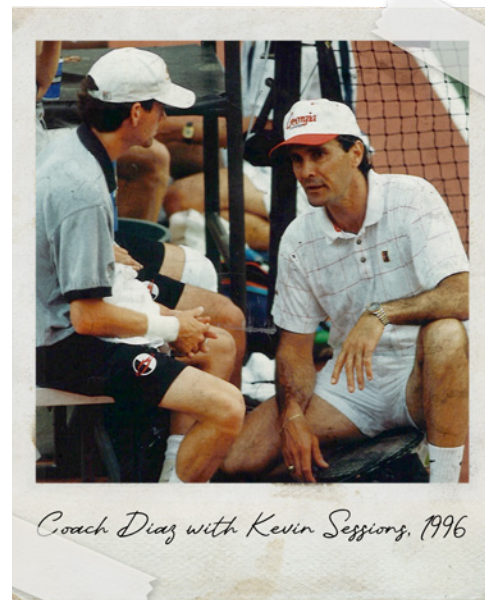

Jamie Hunt, who was part of Georgia's 2007 and 2008 NCAA National Championship teams and most recently served as the associate head coach at Vanderbilt, is in his seventh season back at his alma mater. Hunt was named the Intercollegiate Tennis Association Southeast Region Assistant Coach of the Year for the 2022-23 campaign.

Since returning to the program in the 2017-18 season, Georgia has signed eight blue-chip prospects and earned the No. 2 recruiting class in 2018, No. 3 in 2019, No. 10 in 2021, No. 12 in 2022 and the top-ranked class in 2023 according to TennisRecruiting.net.

The 2023-24 season marks the 14th year of coaching for the San Antonio, Texas native, who spent seven of those at Vanderbilt, where he was an assistant coach for four years and an associate head coach for three. The Commodores made their 15th NCAA tournament appearance in 2017 after Hunt helped the squad ink a top-5 class in 2015 as the team's recruiting coordinator.

Following his playing career, Hunt made his way to Nashville to become an assistant coach at Vanderbilt. The Commodores had an impressive year in 2013, finishing with a No. 15 ITA national ranking following an appearance in the NCAA Round of 16, marking Vanderbilt's highest ranking in over a decade.

In 2015, Hunt helped develop Gonzales Austin into Vanderbilt's second ever SEC Player of the Year, helping the program earn its best SEC record in nearly a decade with an 8-4 mark against league opponents. Under his seven years of leadership in Nashville, four Vanderbilt players were named ITA All-Americans, while two doubles teams reached No. 1 rankings in ITA Doubles.

A U.S. Open Junior Doubles Champion, an All-SEC and All-American performer and winner of the prestigious Southeast Region ITA Arthur Ashe Award for Leadership and Sportsmanship, Hunt was a star tennis player and leader for the Bulldogs' tennis program from 2007 through 2010 as a four-time All-SEC selection. Hunt is a staple in the program's record books - his 116 singles wins ranks 13th all-time in school history, his 122 doubles wins places him second in Bulldog history while his combined singles and doubles record of 238-80 ranks third for Georgia all-time.

In 2008, Hunt compiled a 39-8 singles record, which included a perfect 10-0 mark against conference opponents. The next season, he teamed with Nate Schnugg to reach the quarterfinals of the NCAA doubles championship and earned All-America status. Hunt was the only junior player in history to win the Easter Bowl Doubles in the boys 14's, 16's and 18's. He also earned ITF World Junior rankings as high as No. 2 in doubles and No. 26 in singles.

Hunt and his wife Kyndal Edwards Hunt met as seniors at the University of Georgia. The couple has five children: Daughter Blakely (8), son Hayes (6), three-year-old twins -- daughter Macy and son Hudson -- and Ford, who was born in September of 2022.

BRYCE WARREN - ASSISTANT COACH

Bryce Warren, who helped lead Arizona to back-to-back Pac-12 Championships, will return to the Georgia men's tennis staff as an assistant coach, Manuel Diaz announced July 14, 2023.

Warren previously served as a volunteer for the Bulldogs from 2018-2020, before becoming the assistant coach and eventually the associate head coach for the Arizona men's tennis program. He will serve his third season on Georgia's staff for the 2023-24 season. He joins Diaz and Jamie Hunt on Georgia's staff following a recent ruling from the NCAA regarding additional assistant coach positions.

"We are extremely excited to have Bryce back on our staff," Diaz said. "Throughout his career, he has excelled in player development and has a desire to help student-athletes both on and off the court. Bryce has it all — he is a high-character individual who led Arizona to historic success during his time there. He is someone student-athletes and everyone involved with our program will relate to and admire. I am thrilled to have him back in Athens."

Arizona had its most successful run in program history while Warren was on staff. The Wildcats totaled three straight NCAA tournament berths and advanced to two Super Regionals. Prior to his arrival, Arizona had not won a match in the NCAA tournament since 2004.

The program also won its first Pac-12 regular season title in 2022 and followed it up with another conference championship in 2023. Warren was named the 2023 ITA Southwest Region Assistant Coach of the Year.

"I am thrilled to return to Athens and team up with Coach Diaz and Coach Hunt again," said Coach Warren. "There's no better place to go to work every day than the Home of College Tennis. I would like to thank Manny Diaz, Jamie Hunt and the administration for granting me this opportunity. I am excited to put in the work and help this program compete for championships. Go Dawgs!"

Prior to his first stint on staff at Georgia, Warren served as the assistant academy director for the New England Academy of Tennis in Natick, Mass. where he was in charge of the high performance junior program. He has also worked as a tennis pro at various racquet clubs throughout the Northeast. In 2012, he was the volunteer assistant at the University of Notre Dame.

Warren played collegiately at Butler University from 2007-11, earning first-team All-Horizon league honors in 2009. He then attended Keene State College from 2011-12 and earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in sociology.

From 2003-07, Warren played on the St. Francis DeSales High School boys' tennis team, where he was named first-team all-state and was a four-year No. 1 singles player.

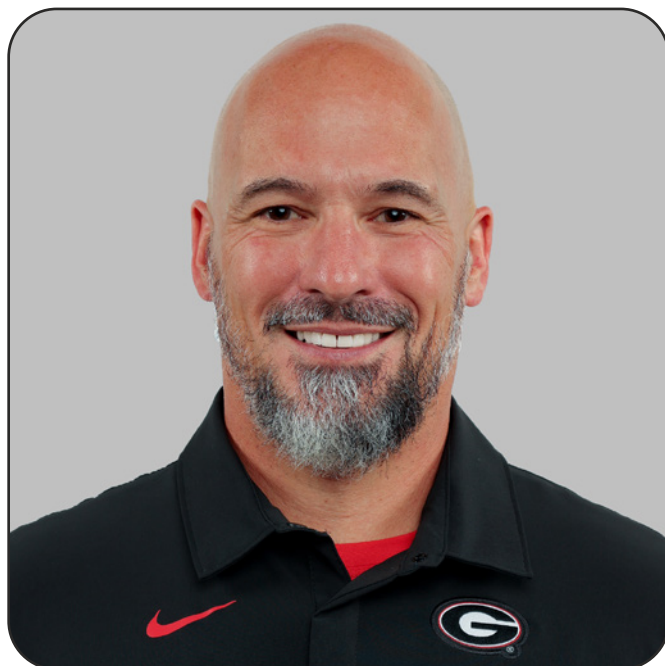

Meet the Staff



JERE W. MOREHEAD UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT

President Jere W. Morehead began his tenure as the 22nd University of Georgia President on July 1, 2013. Under his leadership, UGA has risen in the rankings of the best public colleges and universities and has completed a series of initiatives to enhance student learning and success, including a requirement for experiential learning for all undergraduates.

Additionally during President Morehead's tenure, the University completed the most successful capital campaign in its history and established the UGA Innovation District, through which students and faculty partner with industry leaders to create products and enterprises that strengthen Georgia's economy. UGA has increased its research expenditures by more than 50% over the past decade and has been ranked first or second in the U.S. for research-based products reaching the marketplace for the past seven years.

In keeping with his focus on student success, President Morehead launched the ALL Georgia program to support students from rural areas and created the Double Dawgs program, which enables students to save time and money by earning an undergraduate and graduate degree in five years or less. Demand for a UGA education has more than doubled during the past decade, with a record 43,000 applications submitted for a spot in the incoming Class of 2027.

President Morehead has served the University of Georgia for more than 35 years in both faculty and administrative roles. Before becoming President, he was Senior Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost from 2010 to 2013. Prior to 2010, he held several key administrative assignments, including Vice President for Instruction, Vice Provost for Academic Affairs, Associate Provost and Director of the Honors Program, and acting Executive Director of Legal Affairs.

He is the Meigs Professor of Legal Studies in the Terry College of Business, where he has held a faculty appointment since 1986. He is a co-author of several books and book chapters, including *The Legal and Regulatory Environment of Business*, and he has published scholarly articles on legal topics ranging from export controls to jury selection. He has served as Editor-in-Chief of the *American Business Law Journal*.

President Morehead currently serves as Co-Chair of the University Leadership Forum, a national initiative led by the Council on Competitiveness. Additional service includes membership on the boards of the Georgia Research Alliance, Georgia Chamber of Commerce, Atlanta Regional Council for Higher Education, Metro Atlanta Chamber of Commerce, and Emory University Candler School of Theology.

He is Chair of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division I Board of Directors and a member of the NCAA Division I Administrative Committee and NCAA Board of Governors. He previously served as President of the Southeastern Conference (SEC) and Chair of the SEC Executive Committee and as a member of the NCAA's Presidential Forum; Working Group on Name, Image, and Likeness; and Federal and State Legislation Working Group. He also is a member of the National Football Foundation Board of Trustees.

In 2021, he received the Chief Executive Leadership Award from the Council for the Advancement and Support of Education District III for outstanding leadership and service in support of education. He has received several University-wide teaching awards, including the Josiah Meigs Award—UGA's highest honor for teaching excellence, the Richard B. Russell Award for Excellence in Undergraduate Teaching, the Teacher of the Year Award in the Terry College of Business, and the Lothar Tresp Outstanding Honors Professor Award. He also earned the UGA School of Law's premier honor for alumni, the Distinguished Service Scroll Award.

President Morehead holds a bachelor's degree from Georgia State University and a law degree from the University of Georgia.



JOSH BROOKS J. REID PARKER DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

J. Reid Parker Director of Athletics Josh Brooks — 2023 Sports Business Journal Athletic Director of the Year finalist — has led the University of Georgia Athletic Association through historic success since the time of his hiring in 2021.

Georgia finished seventh in the latest LEARFIELD Directors' Cup, marking the school's best finish since 2005 and tying for the fourth-highest ranking in program history. Seventeen of the Bulldogs' athletic programs earned a top-20 ranking, while nine ended the year in the top 10.

The Bulldogs became the first program to earn back-to-back College Football Playoff National Championships. Three of Georgia's athletic teams won SEC titles and five athletes won NCAA individual crowns during the 2022-23 athletics season.

Among notable achievements, the women's soccer and volleyball programs made history as both teams earned bids to their respective NCAA tournaments in the same year for the first time ever. Georgia's track and field programs finished with four top-10 rankings in the indoor and outdoor championships, both men's and women's tennis captured SEC championships, softball finished with a second-place mark in the conference and both golf programs swept team and individual titles at their respective NCAA regionals.

The Bulldogs also posted a record-breaking academic year, setting a new school-high mark with a 3.19 cumulative GPA in 2022-23, breaking the fall GPA record before earning the second-highest spring GPA in school history.

Brooks has overseen substantial facility upgrades that include the brand-new Lindsey Hopkins Indoor Tennis Courts, improvements to the south side of Sanford Stadium, a \$45 million renovation to Foley Field, a \$38 million upgrade to the Jack Turner Softball Stadium, a new \$1.8 million men's and women's basketball weight room as well as expansive updates to Stegeman Coliseum and a renovation project in the Butts-Mehre Heritage Hall.

Georgia also built a new, state-of-the-art track and field locker room and recently announced plans to construct a one-of-a-kind track facility off South Milledge Avenue. This project will include the only indoor track and field venue in the state of Georgia and will allow the Bulldogs to host NCAA and SEC events as well as summer camps.

Under his guidance, Georgia re-branded the mental health and performance department, bringing in a new full-time director and an additional clinical counselor as well as adding sports psychology services for every team. A Diversity, Equity and Inclusion committee was also established as Courtney Gay was hired to lead in the department's DEI efforts.

Brooks' tenure has also included impactful and significant coaching hires, with a pair of national champions in track and field's Caryl Smith Gilbert and soccer's Keidane McAlpine. In 2021, he hired Tony Baldwin to take over the softball program, while Stefanie Williams Moreno and Neil Versfeld were named head women's and men's swimming and diving coaches.

He also hired two prominent coaches to lead the Georgia Basketball programs in Mike White and Katie Abrahamson-Henderson. Following the 2022-23 baseball season, Brooks brought on renowned pitching coach Wes Johnson to lead Georgia Baseball.

A native of Hammond, La., Brooks' vision of competing for championships and postseason success and his passion for student-athletes began well before his time as Athletic Director.

Before returning to UGA in 2016 as Executive Associate Director of Athletics, Brooks served as Deputy Athletics Director at the University of Louisiana Monroe from 2015-16 and Director of Athletics at Millsaps College from 2014-15. He also served in capacities as Director of Football Operations (2008-11) and Assistant and Associate Athletic Director for Internal Operations (2012-14) in his previous stint at UGA.

Brooks also served as director of football operations at the University of Louisiana-Monroe beginning in 2004. He gained experience as a student at Louisiana State University, working as an equipment manager and a student assistant coach. During his four years at LSU, the Tigers participated in the 2000 Peach Bowl, 2002 Sugar Bowl, and won the 2001 Southeastern Conference championship.

Brooks graduated from LSU ('02) with a degree in Kinesiology and completed his master's degree in Sport Management from UGA ('14). He and his wife, Lillie, have twin sons, Jackson and James, born in July of 2009 and a third son, Davis, born in March of 2012.

He and his wife Lillie have become a vital part of the Athens community. On January 20, 2021, just two weeks after becoming Athletic Director, Brooks pledged \$100,000 to create a need-based scholarship to support UGA students from Athens-Clarke County. His gift created a Georgia Commitment Scholarship (GCS), adding to the more than 550 endowed, need-based scholarships created under the GCS program since its launch in January 2017.

Colby's Hot Start at Longhorn Invitational

During his first matches as a Bulldog, junior Ryan Colby went 3-0 against ranked opponents at the Longhorn Invitational to win the tournament title. The USC standout defeated No. 112 Loris Pourroy (FSU), No. 17 Micah Braswell (Texas) and former teammate No. 22 Peter Makk (USC) in consecutive days to earn two of the highest-ranked wins of his career.

Colby, a native of Alexandria, Va., ended the fall as the highest-ranked Georgia player in the singles ranking at No. 36. He is joined by No. 41 Thomas Paulsell, No. 43 Miguel Perez Peña and No. 112 Cyrus Mahjoob.



Dawgs Claim Titles at Southern Intercollegiate

For the 11th time in the event's history, a Georgia Bulldog claimed the singles and doubles titles at the 55th annual Southern Intercollegiate Championships at the Dan Magill Tennis Complex on Sept. 29 - Oct. 1.

Georgia swept the red draw, with Thomas Paulsell defeating teammate Miguel Perez Peña in the finals to take the singles title while Ryan Colby and Niels Ratiu claimed the doubles title. This marked the 25th title for the Bulldogs in the event in both singles and doubles and the first collegiate tournament title for both Paulsell and Ratiu.



Perez Peña Wins ITA Regional Championship

At the ITA Southeast Regional from Oct. 12-16, junior Miguel Perez Peña and freshman Cyrus Mahjoob each made deep runs in the singles main draw. The two ended up playing each other in the semifinal at Georgia Tech's Ken Byers Tennis Complex, where Perez Peña won the Dawg fight and went on to win the finals as well.

This marked both the second consecutive year a Georgia player won the event and the sixth time since 2013. Following his first collegiate tournament Perez Peña earned a spot at the ITA National Fall Championships, which was played in San Diego on Nov. 1-5.



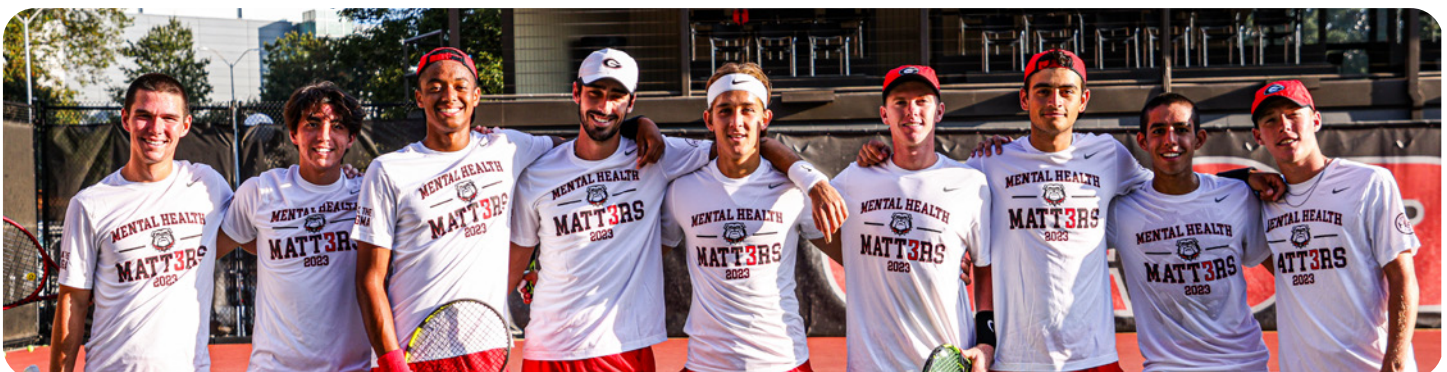

Quinn Wins NCAA Singles National Championship

Ethan Quinn won the 2023 NCAA Singles National Championship in a historic match on May 27, 2023, fending off four championship points from his opponent Ondrej Styler to take the match, by a 6-2, 7-6(5), 6-2 score. Quinn, a redshirt freshman, earned the program's fifth NCAA singles title and became just the fourth freshman in the event's history to win the tournament.

This capped off an already historic year for Quinn, who ended the year on an 18-match win streak. The ITA National Freshman of the Year elected to pursue a professional career, aided by a US Open main draw wildcard from winning the national title as an American-born player.

Georgia Claims 2023 SEC Championship

For the 32nd time in program history, the Georgia Bulldogs won the SEC Championship after going a perfect 12-0 in conference play. The 2023 campaign marked the 16th time that Georgia went undefeated during the SEC portion of its schedule and its first conference title since 2016.

Senior Philip Henning clinched the team's final win over Ole Miss to confirm its unblemished conference record on Senior Day. His 6-2, 6-2 win against No. 65 Nikola Slavic earned him a 10-0 season record in SEC matches.



Elite Bulldogs, Elite Venue

The Dan Magill Tennis Complex, dubbed as the Home of College Tennis and the Bulldogs' home venue, provides a legendary backdrop for the blue-blood tennis program. The 2023 dual-match season proved why the facility is seen as one of the toughest places to come in and play at as a visiting team.

During the Bulldogs' 11 home matches, the team went undefeated, including their three NCAA Tournament matches, outscoring the opposition 54-13 throughout. During the season, 12,277 fans attended matches, with a high of 3,072 spectators for the team's Super Regional match against Harvard on May 13.

SEC CHAMPIONSHIPS

Georgia's 42 total Southeastern Conference championships are by far the most of any school in the SEC. The Bulldogs were led to 13 SEC Regular Season Titles in Dan Magill's tenure while Manuel Diaz has brought the program 19 regular season crowns and 10 tournament titles.



Most recently, Georgia won the 2023 SEC Regular Season Championship, finishing a perfect 12-0 in conference play. This marked the 16th time in program history that the Bulldogs finished its SEC schedule unscathed and the first since 2016.

Since 1971, every letterman of at least four years can has won at least one SEC Championship while playing at Georgia.

The program holds a winning record against all SEC opponents in their history.

1985

The 1985 Georgia squad, led by seniors in the top four positions, was perhaps the most powerful team in school history. The Bulldogs were led by Mikael Pernfors, a native Swede who won a second-straight NCAA singles championship with a victory over teammate and roommate George Bezecny. Bezecny played No. 2 for the Bulldogs while Allen Miller, a four-time All-American, was No. 3. The rest of the lineup consisted of Deane Frey at No. 4 singles, Philip Johnson at No. 5 and freshman Trey Carter at No. 6. Georgia finished the spring dual match schedule with a perfect 26-0 record.

1987

The 1987 Georgia tennis team completed the SEC hat trick by winning the indoor tournament, the conference round robin with a 9-0 record and the league outdoor championship. The lineup for the 1987 national champions consisted of the following players: Philip Johnson at No. 1 singles, Stephen Enochs at No. 2, John Boytim at No. 3 and Trey Carter at No. 4. Rounding out the Bulldogs' lineup was Mike Morrison at No. 5 singles with T.J. Middleton at No. 6. Freshman Jim Childs saw significant action at No. 6 singles and was a regular at No. 3 doubles.

1999

The 1999 Bulldogs entered the newly formatted 64-team tournament as the No. 10 seed. Through the course of the regional and championship tournaments, the Bulldogs overcame seemingly insurmountable odds, fighting off three team match points to rise to the top. In the team final against top-ranked UCLA, Georgia opened with wins at Nos. 1 and 2 to claim the doubles point. The Bruins retaliated, proving that they would not go quietly. Falling into a tie in singles play, junior Joey Pitts swung the balance for the Bulldogs in a three-setter at the No. 4 position.

2001

The 2001 Bulldogs etched their name in the annals of Georgia tennis history and also the NCAA record books as just the second program to win the title, fail to reach the Round of 16 the following year and then claim another NCAA crown in a span of three years. Georgia rode a 25-match winning streak through the tournament to capture the program's fourth national title. In the team final, Georgia clinched the doubles point, but lost the first set in three singles matches. However, with Georgia leading 3-1, Chad Carlson topped Adam Carey 6-1, 5-7, 6-2 to clinch the match for the Bulldogs.

2007

The 2007 Bulldogs completed their dream season by winning the program's fifth NCAA title on their home court. The crown was the final piece to a perfect puzzle as the squad captured every possible team title during its undefeated run, which also included the ITA Team Indoor National Championship and the SEC Tournament. Georgia was so dominant that for the first time in team history, the Bulldogs never allowed an opponent more than two points in a match. Even then, the opposition gained two points only twice, and Georgia registered a total of 22 shutouts.

2008

The 2008 Bulldogs became the first squad to win back-to-back NCAA Championship titles since Stanford in 1997-98. Georgia officially captured the title by defeating Texas in the finals, 4-2. However, arguably the victory most indicative of the Bulldogs' talent came in the semifinal round as Georgia topped undefeated, No. 1-ranked and heavily-favored Virginia, 4-3. On the run to the national championship, the Bulldogs also captured their third consecutive regular-season Southeastern Conference championship with a 10-1 record.
